Jaisinghpur, is a small town of Kangra district of Himachal Pradesh. It is situated on the bank of river Beas that enhances its beauty. It was named after the Katoch king Maharaja Jai Singh. It is also the birth place of famous Katoch king of Kangra, Maharaja Sansar Chand, who was born here in 1765 AD at Bijapur, 3 Km far from present Jaisinghpur town. The town abounds in temples of ancient architectural excellence that are an integral part of its historical, cultural and spiritual heritage.

Erstwhile Vyas Valley Private College was taken over by the government on 6th Feb, 2007 and named after Kanwar Durga Chand. 
## Department of Chemistry Dr. Inder Kumar

## ELIGIBILITY CONDITIONS FOR ADMISSION IN BA/B.Sc./ B. COM 1st

## Year\*

- Age An applicant must not be more than 23 years (25 years for girls) of age as on First July of 2025.
   However, in case of overage candidates, the Vice-Chancellor may allow age relaxation up to six months. In case of Scheduled Caste/ Scheduled Tribe students, relaxation in age up to three years is allowed as per rules.
- Marks A student who has passed 10+2 examination or an equivalent course can get admission in the first year of the three-year degree course if he/she fulfills the eligibility conditions.
  - i) B.A latYear: -

It is mandatory to have at least 33% of marks in 10+2 examination for applicant seeking admission in **B.A.** 1st Year provided he has passed English as subject in 10+2 level. For candidates opting for Mathematics as one of the subject of study are required to fulfil the minimum criteria i.e., percentage should either be 45% marks in aggregate or 45% marks in Mathematics at +2 level.

#### Bachelor of Science (B.Sc. 1st year Pass Course): -

It is mandatory to have at least 45% marks in 10+2 examination or an examination equivalent to it from a recognized Board/ University established by law in India with passing marks in four written subjects (three Science elective subjects & one English) for applicant seeking admission in Bachelor of Science (Pass Course).

#### iii) B. Com 1stYear: -

For applicant seeking admission in B. Com 1st year, the minimum eligibility is 40% marks for those who have passed 10+2 from Commerce stream. However, it is 45% for other students provided they have studied Mathematics/ Economics as compulsory subjects at 10+2 level. The eligibility condition varies in case of Girl Students i.e., minimum 33% marks for Girl students.

- iv) If a candidate does not produce the actual marks certificate from a University/Board in respect of +2 examination or equivalent examination where the result is shown in grades and standards etc. the minimum percentage of marks for each subject given in standards will be taken into consideration for determining their eligibility.
- A relaxation of 5% marks is given for SC/ST candidates seeking admission in B. Sc/ B. Com stream.
- An applicant having a compartment in 10+2 will not be admitted.
- 4. Admission in 1st year of B.A./ B.Sc. / B. Com will be as per the 120-point Reservation Roster system
- 5. Since the Executive Council of H.P. University has approved the CBCS template of UGC for academic session 2017-2018 onwards and annual system 2018-19 onwards, the combination of elective subject chosen as Discipline Specific Core can be allotted/given to the students as per the availability of faculties in the subject and infrastructure in the respective colleges. While allotting the Discipline Specific courses in science subjects, the combination of pure science subjects should be allotted as per the CBCS template of UGC. The students who seek admission in the UG degree will have choice of the students depending upon the availability of the teachers and infrastructure. Their degrees, however, will be named B.A., B.Sc., B.Com., etc. on the basis of the faculty. (i.e. Languages, Social Sciences, Life Sciences, Physical Science etc.) of the majority (two out of three) of the subjects chosen by the students.

## ADMISSION RULES

There are some general guidelines that needs to be followed in order to pursue B.A. / B.Sc. / B.Com. first year of bachelor 's degree. All the three courses mentioned above will be according to the choice based credit system (CBCS). The guidelines are as follows:

- 1. Admission will be strictly on fulfillment of eligibility conditions (as given above)
- Applicants who have passed Prabhakar are not eligible for admission.
- 3. Application form must be complete in all respects along with the following documents:
  - (a) Self Attested copy of detailed marks certificate of the 10+2 examination
  - (b) Original Character Certificate from the institution last attended
  - (c) Self Attested copy of Matriculation certificate/date of birth certificate.
  - (d) Two passport size photographs (one pasted on Library card and another on the admission form) (e) A passport size photograph of the parents to be affixed on PTA membership form
  - (f) A photocopy of Adhar card (self-attested).
  - (g) To avail concession in tuition fee, Girl students must bring an attested copy of H.P. Bonafide Certificate.
  - (h) Candidates, coming from Boards/Universities other than HP Board of School Education / HPU Shimla, must produce migration certificate in original. Those who have passed first year /second year of a degree course from other than H.P. University will have to produce Equivalence Certificate from Himachal Pradesh University.
  - Applicants must attach documentary proof for SC/ST/ OBC/ IRDP/BPL/ physically challenged and sports and cultural activities participation.
  - (j) Income certificate is mandatory for all students.
- 4. A student must produce original certificates whenever asked to do so.


#### Important Points:

- Rules for admission are subject to change as per HPU notifications from time to time.
- Admission of a student is liable to be cancelled if he/she furnishes incomplete /wrong /false information or in
  case of concealment of facts. Disciplinary action will also be taken against such candidates.
- Notwithstanding eligibility for admission, the Principal can refuse admission if the conduct of any student has not been up to the mark during past years.
- Initially, all the admissions will be provisional (i.e. subject to approval by H.P. University).
- A student can migrate from one college to another in accordance with the rules laid down by the H.P.
   University. However, such students must obtain the approval of the concerned Admission Committee.
- Students seeking exemption from tuition fee for disability must attach an attested copy of 40% disability certificate.
- The Principal reserves the right to allow, disallow or cancel any admission at any stage.
- Candidate seeking admission for the first time in this college must be accompanied by his/her parents/guardians
  to the admission committee.
- Any gap in the academic career of an applicant must be supported by documentary evidence and selfundertaking.

## Documents required for Admission to B. A/B. Com/B.sc 2nd and 3rd year.

- Fee receipt of the second installment of fees paid in first year.
- 2. Admit card of first year final examinations.
- Character Certificate in case of migrating students.

## RESERVATIONS (ORDINANCE 3.1)

- (1) Admission to the various courses of study shall be open to all persons, irrespective of race, creed, caste or class subject to the following conditions: -
- a). 15% and 7.5% of the seats shall be reserved for bonafide Himachali Schedule Castes and Schedule Tribes candidates respectively who have passed their qualifying examination (+2) from any institute/board located in Himachal or from any other board established by law in India which is equivalent to the qualifying examination (+2) as per H.P. University.
- b). The remaining 771/2% seats shall be filled as under: -
- i) 25% of the seats for admission shall be open for all the candidates irrespective of the Institution from where they have passed their qualifying examination.
- ii) 75% of the seats shall be filled out of the candidates who have passed their qualifying examination from H.P. Board of Education or any other board located in H.P. subject to the following reservations:
  - a) 5% of the seats shall be reserved for outstanding sportsmen/women.
  - b) 5% of the seats shall be reserved for outstanding cultural activists.
  - c) 3% of the seats shall be reserved for Persons with Disabilities (PwD): -3% of the seats shall be reserved for Physically Handicapped candidates who are Himachal Pradesh Domicile. The Registrar, H.P. University, Shimla vide letter/notification No. 4-16/2012HPU(Acad.) dated 2.1.2013 has conveyed the decision of Executive Council of its meeting held on 17.9.2012 taken vide Any Other Item adopted the H.P. State Govt.'s Instructions/Rules that no tuition fee be charged from the students with 40% and above disability. The student with special needs with more than 40% disability, admitted in any course of study running in the Himachal Pradesh University, Shimla will not be charged any fees with effect from the current academic session 2015-16 vide notification No. 4-51/2015 HPU (Acad) dated 25 July 2015.

#### TIME LIMIT FOR THE DEGREE (for UG degree course)

- a) Regular candidate shall have to undergo the prescribed course of study in a college affiliated to the H.P. University for period not less than 3 academic years (and not more than 5 academic years) to pass the examination.
- b) For the degree (B.A. / B.Sc. / B.Com.) the student will have to cumulate a minimum of 132 successful credit hours of Course work for a bachelor's degree over a minimum of 3 years and maximum of 5 years from the date of admission.

### ADMISSION THROUGH MIGRATION

Inter-Institutional migration (including from one college to another as well as from a college to the ICDEOL and vice versa) of students will be allowed when no-objection certificate is obtained from both the relieving and receiving institutions signed by their respective Principals/ Directors to ascertain especially that the major/minor/discipline specific course/elective courses being studied by the migrating student are available in the receiving institution. The procedure for migration is as follows: -

- I. A student wishing to migrate to GDC Jaisinghpur will be allowed only when seats are vacant in the subject and subject combination that are provided here.
- II. On a prescribed Performa, a student has to get consent of the teachers and principal of his/her college and the college he/she wished to migrate.
- III. If permission given, then two Non-objection certificates are to be obtained by the. University.
  One of these is meant for the old college and second for the new one. A migrating student has to submit the following documents with the migration certificate:
  - a) Lecture attendance of the subjects.
  - b) Statement of credit earned under CCA.
  - c) Original Character Certificate from the Principal of college last attended.
  - d) Admission will be given during the time period provided by the H.P. University.
  - e) A student migration to GDC Jaisinghpur shall have to pay admission-fee afresh, but the monthly fee will be charged from the month of joining of the college.
  - f)A student seeking migration from a private college will also pay the annual fee.

All the conditions and requirements for the degree including the time frame will remain as given above and other clauses of the regulations.

\*Conditions subject to change as per HP University/ SPU/HP Government latest rules and regulation.

## Choice Based Credit System (CBCS)

#### An outline of the course:

Admission to the first year of bachelor's degree (B.A./B.Sc./B.Com.) will be according to the choice based credit system(CBCS). The main feature of the choice based system (CBCS) is to make Undergraduate

courses student centric rather than system centric or teacher centric. In order to achieve this objective, the CBCS strives to create a holistic syllabus. It comprises of the following three courses:

- Core Course.
- Elective Course.
- Ability and Skill Enhancement Course.

Core Course refers to a course, which should compulsorily be studied by a candidate as a core requirement is termed as a Core course. Additionally, to focus on a discipline through core papers in general curriculum, elective papers have been introduced that will provide students the freedom to choose the allied/applied/broad areas of their discipline.

Elective Course generally a course which can be chosen from a pool of courses and which may be very specific or specialized or advanced or supportive to the discipline/subject of study or which provides an extended scope or which enables an exposure to some other discipline/subject/domain or nurtures the candidate's proficiency/skill is called an Elective Course

So, the CBCS provides an opportunity for the students to choose courses from the prescribed courses comprising core, elective and skill based courses. These courses can be evaluated following the grading system. This will benefit the students to move across institutions both within India and across countries. In other to bring uniformity in evaluation system the computation of the Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) is based on student's performance in examination as per the UGC formulated guidelines. However, in keeping with the spirit of CBCS the students will have complete freedom to choose these courses from a pool suggested by the UGC/University.

## Advantages of the choice-based credit system:

- Shift in focus from the teacher-centric to student-centric education.
- Student may undertake as many credits as they can cope with (without repeating all courses in a given semester if they fail in one/more courses).
- CBCS allows students to choose inter-disciplinary, intra-disciplinary courses, skill oriented papers (even from other disciplines according to their learning needs, interests and aptitude) and more flexibility for students).

- CBCS makes education broad-based and at par with global standards. One can take credits by combining unique combinations. For example, Physics with Economics, Microbiology with Chemistry or Environment Science etc.
- CBCS offers flexibility for students to study at different times and at different institutions to complete
  one course (ease mobility of students). Credits earned at one institution can be transferred.

#### Duration

The UG (CBCS) programme for a regular student shall be for a minimum period of three years and a maximum of five years from the date of admission of the candidate.

#### COURSES IN PROGRAMMES

The UG(CBCS) programme in the college affiliated to the HPU will comprise the following categories of courses. a. Core Courses B. Elective Courses C. Ability and Skill Enhancement Courses

- a. Core Course: A course which should compulsorily be studied by a student as a core requirement is termed as Core Course. Number of Core Papers for a General Programmed in Science (B.Sc.) shall be 12 and for General Programme in Arts (B.A.) & Commerce (B.Com.) shall have 12 Core Courses each. Besides, there will be 2 papers each of English and Hindi/MIL in B.A./B. Com) as Compulsory Courses. The course designed for papers under this category aim to cover the basics that a student is expected to imbibe in that particular discipline.
- b. Elective Course: Generally, a course which can be chosen from a pool of courses and which may be very specific or specialized or advanced or supportive to the discipline/subject of study or which provides an extended scope or which enables an exposure to some other discipline/subject/domain or nurtures the candidate's proficiency/skill is called an Elective Course.
  - Discipline Specific Elective Course (2 each for regular courses): Elective courses offered under the main discipline/subject of study is referred to as Discipline Specific Elective.
  - Generic Elective (GE) Course (2 courses each for B.A./B.Com. regular courses): An elective
    course chosen from an unrelated discipline/subject, with an intention to seek exposure beyond
    discipline/s of choice is called a Generic Elective. The purpose of this category of papers is to offer
    the students the option to explore disciplines of interest beyond the choices they make in Core and
    Discipline Specific Elective papers.

- c). Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECCs): —AECCI courses are the courses based upon the content that leads to Knowledge enhancement. These are: Environmental Science, English Communication/Hindi Communication/MIL Communication. These are mandatory for all disciplines.
- d). Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC) (4 for regular courses): SEC courses are value-based and/or skill-based and are aimed at providing hands-on-training, competencies, skills, etc. These courses may be chosen from a pool of courses designed to provide value-based and/or skill-based knowledge and should contain both theory and lab/hands-on/training/field work. The main purpose of these courses is to provide students life-skills in hands-on mode so as to increase their employability.
- e). An undergraduate degree in Science disciplines may be awarded if a student completes 4 core courses each in three disciplines of choice, 2 Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses, minimum 4 Skill Enhancement Courses and 2 papers each from a list of Discipline Specific Elective paper based on three disciplines of choice selected above, respectively.
- f). An Undergraduate degree in Humanities/ Social Sciences/ Commerce may be awarded if a student completes 4 core papers each in two disciplines of choice, 2 compulsory core papers each in English and Hindi/MIL, respectively, 2 Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC), minimum 4 Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC), 2 papers each from a list of Discipline Specific Elective papers based on the two disciplines of choice selected above, respectively, and two papers from the list of Generic Electives papers.

### PROGRAMMES UNDER CBCS

- a) B.A. (Arts / Humanities / Languages) a) Language Group: English, Hindi.
- b) Social Science / Humanities Group: Economics, Political Science, History, Geography, Physical Education, Philosophy and Psychology.
- c) Arts and Applied Social Science Group: Music.
- b) B.Sc. a) Natural Science Group: Physics, Chemistry, Botany, Zoology, Geography, Mathematics.
- b) Methods and Techniques Group: Mathematics, Computer Applications.
- c) B.Com. / B.B.A. (Commerce/Management) a) Commerce, Management.

#### EVALUATION SYSTEM

All courses (Core, DSE, AECC & SEC) involve an evaluation system of students that has the following two components:

- a) Continuous Comprehensive Assessment (CCA) accounting for 30% of the final grade that a student gets in a course; and
- b) Annual Examination accounting for the remaining 70% of the final grade that the student gets in a course.

#### a) Continuous Comprehensive Assessment:

This would have the following components:

- I. Classroom Attendance: Each student will have to attend a minimum of 75% Lectures / Tutorials / Practical's. A student having less than 75% attendance will not be allowed to appear in the annual Examination. Those having between 74% and 65% attendance will apply for exemption in a prescribed form accompanied by clear reason(s) for absence to the authorized functionaries. Those having between 64% and 50% attendance will apply for exemption in a prescribed form accompanied by a Medical Certificate from a Government Hospital. The exemption from 75% attendance will be given to those participating in prescribed co-curricular activities (e.g. NCC, NSS, Youth Festivals, Sports, etc.) to the extent of 25% (making the necessary attendance as 50% in the annual examination cases). However, the claim for this exemption should be supported by authenticated certificate from the concerned college authorities. Candidates who are getting the exemptions, except for those getting exemptions for co-curricular activities, will not be entitled for getting the CCA marks for classroom attendance as given below:
- II. Classroom Attendance Incentive: Those having greater than 75% attendance (for those participating in Co-curricular activities, 25% will be added to per cent attendance) will be awarded CCA marks as follows (out of 5): -
  - 75% to 79% 1 mark
  - ii) 80% to 84% 2 marks
  - iii) 85% to 89% 3marks
  - iv) 90% to 95% 4 marks
  - v) 95% above 5 marks
- III. Mid-Term examination There will be one house examination, to be conducted when approx. 2/3 of the syllabus has been covered. This examination will be for 15 marks and will be conducted by the college in consultation with the teachers. In laboratory courses (having only practical (P) component), the students will be tested on the basis of laboratory exercises given by the course teacher concerned. Rest of the procedure will remain the same as above. The remaining 10 marks of the CCA will be awarded on the basis of seminar / assignment / term paper etc. that the course teacher might give to the students.
- b) ANNUAL EXAMINATION The remaining 70% of the final grade of the student in a course will be on the basis of an annual examination that will be for three hours' duration and will be covering the whole syllabus of the course.

Note: Only those students will be allowed to appear in the annual examination who are successful in the CCA.

- \* A candidate who does not pass the annual examination in any course(s) or due to some reason is not able to appear in this examination, other conditions being fulfilled, and so is considered as 'Fail'), shall be permitted to appear in such failed course(s) in the subsequent supplementary/annual examination as per the instructions issued by HP University Shimla time to time.
- \* The registration for the annual examination will be done at the time of the enrolment for the course at the beginning of the session. The fee for the annual examination will also be collected at that time as decided by the university from time to time.
- \* A student, who fulfills all the requirements for appearing in annual examination, is unable to appear in the examination or to complete it on account of his/her own serious illness, accident, or on account of the death of near relative (mother, father, brother and sister), or the dates of state or national level examinations falls on dates of the annual examination may be allowed to appear in the annual examination in the next academic year. Permission to sit in the examination will be permitted by college Principal/Director on the production of a valid certificate/document from the competent authority. The college will send the name of the student to the Registration and Migration Cell for information.

### Reservation Roster

There are some reservation policies made by H.P Government and, H.P University follow all the rules and regulations as mentioned in the policy. The details of reservation roster devised by H.P. University are as follows:

Schedule Caste (SC):	15%
Schedule Tribe (ST):	7.5%
Sports (SP):	5%
Cultural Activities (CUL):	5%
Person with Disability (PC):	5%
Economic Weaker Section (EWS):	10%

These reservations will be applicable to those, who have passed their qualifying examination from H.P. Board of School Education or from any other Schools located within territorial Jurisdiction of Himachal Pradesh or bonafide resident of Himachal Pradesh. Sports and cultural seats will allotted to those events that are recognized by HPU sports and co-curricular council. The final decision under sports and cultural quota will be with the respective committees constituted for the same. For reservation, the following roster will followed:

#### RULES FOR PAYMENT OF COLLEGE DUES

1. At the time of admission, a student must deposit the dues well in time as and when notified.

- Fee is normally submitted in two installments.
- Students who have failed to pay their fees by the notified date will pay their dues with late fee (See the table above for amount of charges). No postponement of dues beyond the given date is permissible.
- Name of those students will be struck off who do not pay college dues as per schedule.
- Every student must keep the fee receipts safe throughout the session as per proof of payment of college dues.

#### FACILITIES

#### National Service Scheme (NSS):

NSS has a pivotal role in inculcating the value of social service and a sense of responsibility towards society.

Our college has one unit of NSS. To earn a certificate of service, a volunteer needs to devote 240 hours of service. Participation in 7 days camp is mandatory.

#### Eco chib:

Eco club plays an important role to sensitize students towards the nature and eco-friendly environment.

#### Rovers and Rangers:

Rovers and rangers aim to make the students socially aware, helpful and self-reliant. They participate in many social activities. Admission to it will be based on the ability and commitment of a student.

#### Red Ribbon Club:

The purpose of this club is to create awareness about HIV/AIDS through service, education and philanthropic events. Students are urged to join the club to enhance a joint battle against this incurable disease.

#### Career and Counselling / Guidance Cell:

The members of this cell organize many professional lectures for the final year students to give them a good exposure to their prospective career opportunities after completion of graduation.

#### Cultural Committees for HPU Youth Festival - I-IV groups:

The cultural committees are meant to nurture various abilities of students so they can perform to their best capacity in the H.P. University Youth Festival. Students are prepared for Elocution, Painting, Rangoli, Cartooning, Quiz, Dance, Music, Singing, Drama and Skit.

#### Sports:

Students who are good sportsmen/women are given ample training, coaching by the department of physical education. Such players then go on to perform well in the H.P. University inter college/university championship. Training is given in all games. Athletic meet is organized each year in the campus.

#### Kunj Dwar:-

Each year the college publishes a literary magazine entitled Kunj Dwar. Its simple purpose is to give expression to the students who are blessed with the gift of writing, be it an essay, a poem, a short story, snippets of various kinds and informative pros piece. It also horns the editing skills for students who are chosen as its editors.

#### Parents and Teacher Association (PTA)

Parents, being one of the stakeholders in education have been assigned to participate as well as play an advisory role in the functioning of college. Regular meetings of PTA are held to deliberate on the issues related to the development and welfare of the students.

#### Annual Prize Distribution Function:

At the end of the academic session, college organizes the annual prize distribution function. Students who score the first, the second and the third positions in the aggregate and the first and the second positions in the individual subjects in the annual exams are awarded with prizes and certificates. These are also awarded for the winners, outstanding performances in H.P. University, Youth Festival and Sports Championship and for outstanding services in all clubs and societies.

#### Scholarships:

Eligible and deserving students can avail a number of scholarships that are provided by our Government under various schemes. A student has to apply for it on prescribed form that can be obtained from the office of college. It should be supported by the relevant documents of education qualification etc. and be duly verified and attested by a competent authority. A committee has been formed to look in the matter of the award of scholarships. #### Women Development Cell:

On the directions of Hon'ble Supreme Court of India, the college has established a women development cell. Its objective is to redress grievances related to gender bias and sexual harassment against any girl student and the women staff of the college.

#### Canteen:

College has newly constructed canteen which provides breakfast, Lunch, tea and snacks. The canteen has ample place for sitting and dinning. It is located within campus and on the considerable distance from the classrooms.

#### Gym:

College provides Gym facilities within the campus. A well-maintained Gym with basic amenities like Treadmill, Cycle, Dumbbells, Bench Press (Incline, Flat & Decline), Leg Pulling down, Leg Curl Extension etc. are provided.

#### Smart Class Rooms:

The College has three smart class rooms synced with smart ICT equipment like touch screens and podium with audio-video connectivity and K-Yan. These rooms have high speed internet connectivity, trending software and commodious infrastructure.

#### Seminar / Webinar Room:

College has well-furnished seminar / Webinar / conference room equipped with modern interactive panel, camera, audio visual aids and round table and chairs.

#### Multi-Purpose Hall:

College has multipurpose hall characterized with Podium, Projector, White Screen, CCTV Cameras, Two dressing rooms and ample seating capacity for students and guests. This hall is also used to conduct examinations and various functions of academic as well as non-academic purpose.

#### OSA (Old Student Association):

In order to maintain a sense of continuity and community among the institutions graduates, the Old Students Association (OSA) plays a crucial role as a bridge between its history and present. The association enhance the lives of its former students and preserves the alma maters legacy in a variety of ways. It gives alumni the chance to re-connect, reflect, and offer support to one another on a personal and professional level through its network.

## Anti-Ragging/Indiscipline Rules

In order to have zero tolerance to ragging and its total elimination from the educational institutions, the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India vide its order dated 4th May, 2001, 16th May, 2007 and 11th Feb., 2009 has directed as hereunder:

- Ragging is banned in the institution.
- Any one indulging in ragging is liable to be punished appropriately. Punishment shall be Exemplary and Justifiable harsh.
- Punishment for ragging includes:
  - (i) Imprisonment/fine or both.
  - (ii) Expulsion from the institution, suspension from the institution or classes for a limited period or fine with a public apology.
  - (iii) With holding scholarships or other benefits.
  - (iv) Debarring from representation in events.
  - (v) Withholding of results.
  - (vi) Suspension or expulsion from hostel or mess and the like.
- In the hostels, the entry of seniors and outsiders shall be prohibited before and after specified hours
  of the day except under the authority or the persons in-charge (Warden or Hostel Superintendent).
- If the individuals committing or abetting ragging are not identified, collective punishment shall be resorted to.

## General Rules and Regulations of College

#### Discipline and Conduct

For the smooth execution of all the activities of college, it is essential that each and every student behave in the most disciplined manner. Otherwise, if there is any breach of it, the Principal and the teaching staff have the power to punish a violator by imposing a fine, a temporary suspension and even expulsion from college. Each student has to strictly follow the following rules and regulations to maintain strict discipline in college:

- To attend classes and practical regularly when the session commences. As per H.P. University
  rules it is mandatory, for a student to attend 75% lectures in all courses of study. Otherwise, his/her
  examination form may be withheld or rejected.
- 2. The Director of Higher Education, H.P., vide letter no. EDM-HE(21)B(15)2017-V had directed that the use of mobile phones in classrooms and campus of educational institutions will not be allowed. So, the use of mobiles by students in classrooms, laboratories, library, examination hall and corridors are strictly forbidden. They are advised to keep their cells on silent mode. A violetears cell will be confiscated and a fine or Rs 100 will be levied from them. Playing music on the cell is also prohibited.
- Be respectful to teachers, friendly to one another and polite with the non-teaching staff. Use of foul language towards them will be viewed as an offence.
- Do not stand idly and chatter in corridors. Maintain silence. Move quietly from one class/lab to another.
- Identity card:
  - a. The Library card will be issued by librarian immediately after the admission as per the schedule prescribed by him/her.
  - b. Due to danger posed by Covid-19 students without their ID shall not be allowed to enter the campus. They will be treated as outsiders and turn back or a fine of Rs. 200 will be charged.
  - c. In case the card is lost, a duplicate will be issued after producing the FIR of its loss. A fee of Rs 20 will be charged for it.
  - d. Students are not permitted to replace their photographs on ID card due to any reason what so ever.
- 6. Smoking, chewing of tobacco, gutka, drinking etc. inside and outside of campus is strictly

prohibited. A student caught doing so will be imposed penalty of Rs 200 and may even face a disciplinary action.

- Notices: students are directed to carefully read notices on the notice board and strictly follow the instructions before leaving the college.
- Outsiders are not allowed in the campus. A student who brings any outsider will be penalized as under college rules.
- Sticking, hanging of unauthorized posters, bills, notices and writing of slogans on the walls of the College is strictly prohibited. Fines may be imposed for such acts.
- Scribbling and writing on blackboards, walls, furniture is prohibited.
- Tampering with electrical fitting etc. in the classrooms, hostel and other places of campus is also prohibited.
- Those functions will be allowed in campus ground or hall which are either organized by college or have been permitted under the college rules.
- The acts of meetings, functions, parties and taking photographs in the college premises without \prior permission of Principal are acts of indiscipline.
- Anti-Ragging Instructions:

#### DEFINITION OF RAGGING:

Ragging means any act, conduct or practice by dominant power of senior students, former students or outsiders brought to bear on the students freshly enrolled or students who are in any way considered junior by other students and includes individuals or collective acts or practice which:

- Involves physical or psychological assault or threat or use of force or wrongful confinement or restraint or violates status, dignity and honor of such students.
- Exposes students to ridicule and contempt and affect their self-esteem OR entails verbal abuse and aggression indecent gestures and obscene behavior.

#### PROHIBITION OF RAGGING:

- No person shall practice in any form within or outside the premises of college.
- Any person who violates or contravenes the provision of Anti-Ragging Act shall, on conviction
  be punished with imprisonment for a term which may extend up to 3 years or with a fine which may
  extend to 50000, Rupees or with both.
- Teasing girl's students in any manner is an offence and is punishable under the law. Hence, students
  are advised to refrain from such activities otherwise they would face strict legal action.

#### EXPULSION OF A STUDENT:

As per the directions of Hon'ble Supreme Court of India Ragging is a punishable offence and students

convicted of an offence shall be expelled from college and FIR will be registered against him/her and shall not be admitted in any college/educational institution for a period of three years from the date of order of such expulsion. #### THE RULES OF LIBRARY

Students are expected to make the maximum use of the facilities of library during their free periods.

- Only two books shall be issue data time for a period of 14days. If the issued book(s) is not returned or re – issued in time a fine will be charged per book, per day.
- Reference books will not be issued.
- In case of a loss or damage of an issued book, it will either be replaced or its payment of the
  present cost will be accepted only with the permission of Principal.

#### LIBRARYCARD

Identity card is an important document as it shows the identity of a bonafide student. Identity cum library card should be collected from the college library as per schedule prescribed by the Librarian. Each student must carry this card while in the college. In case of loss of the identity card, duplicate identity card will be issued after producing the FIR in this context. For duplicate identity card, Rs.20 will be charged. Students are not permitted to replace his /her photograph pasted on the identity card for any reason whatsoever.

Students must carry their ID-Card along with them if anyone found without ID-Card will be fined Rs.50/-

#### LEAVE RULES:

No student is supposed to be absent without getting his / her leave sanctioned by a course

teacher.

- II. Leave up to 06 days shall be sanctioned by the concerned subject teacher.
- III. Leave for more than six days shall be sanctioned by the principal.
- IV. The student will be marked on-leave during the leave period and the same will not be considered for calculating the lecture attendance for determining eligibility to appear in the University exam.
- V. Students who are officially deputed to participate in NSS / Sports and extra-curricular activities of the H.P. University Youth Festival / Championships are treated on leave for the purpose of attendance, provided that prior permission has been sought from the Principal in this matter and its note has been made by the subject teacher in the attendance register.
- VI No leave will be granted during the Mid Term Examination.
- VII. It is personal responsibility of each student to get his/her name entered in the attendance register of each concerned subject teacher. If he/she fails to do so, he/she will be treated absent.

#### NAME STRUCK OFF AND RE-ADMISSION:

- I. If a student willingly remains absent continuously for 06 days without sanction of leave, his/her name will be struck off from the College as per the rules. He/she will have to seek re-admission on the recommendation of the subject teacher concerned.
- II. Re-admission will be allowed within the next 06 days by paying the re-admission fee and absence fine as per rules, subject to the approval of Principal.
- III. Re-admission fee for the first time is Rs 100 and for the second time Rs 200.
- IV. There will be no new admission for the third time.

- V. Character/migration certificate(s) issued by the institution shall have and entry apart from that of general conduct and behavior to the effect whether the student had participated in ragging and in particular was punished for ragging.
- VI. In case the applicant for admission is found to have indulged in ragging/ indiscipline in the past or if it is noticed later that he has indulged in ragging, admission may be refused or he/she shall be expelled from the institution forthwith.
